### Semi Final Format, Timetable and Dress Code

All students who enter the Awards take part in the semifinals, performed in front of a live audience and the adjudicators at St John's College Auditorium.

Finalists are selected at the semi finals, and return on Sunday for the finals.

#### Semi Final Format

All students take part in an open class on stage.

Advanced Foundation, Advanced 1 and Advanced 2 female identifying students also do pointe work.

Advanced 1 and Advanced 2 students also learn a Contemporary Solo before the open class.

#### Semi Final Class Dress Code:

Classical examination attire only must be worn.

Female identifying – All students are to wear black leotards only (no logos, no lace, no diamantes, no mesh, no adornments).

Headpieces cannot be worn – no sparkles, no flowers, no adornments are to be worn in hair. A single black ribbon only can be worn in hair.

Male identifying - Black/navy tights and white sleeveless or sleeved leotard.

### Semi Final - Audience

Family and friends are encouraged to purchase tickets to watch the open class (between 1hr and 1.5hrs approx. duration depending on the level) and hear the adjudicators select the finalists. ### Finals Format

All finalists perform their chosen exam dance or variation from the relevant exam they have completed in 2022 (excluding character dance).

Advanced 1 and Advanced 2 Finalists also perform the Contemporary Solo they were taught on Saturday 18 March.

### Finalist Timetable - Students

Grade 4, 5 and Intermediate Foundation:

Arrive 9am finish approx. 1pm Intermediate, Advanced Foundation, Advanced 1 and 2: Arrive 1pm finish approx. 5:30pm

### Finals - Audience

### Grade 4, 5 and Intermediate Foundation:

11am start. Finish approx. 1pm, no interval

Intermediate, Advanced Foundation, Advanced 1 and 2:

3pm start. Finish approx. 5:30pm, no interval

### Finals Dress Code

Female identifying – classical examination attire only to be worn as per the chosen dance or variation from exams they completed in 2022.

Grade 4 and 5 may wear a chiffon skirt.



### Finals Dress Code Cont...

Leotards must be one of the RAD approved examination colours, however no logos, no lace, no diamantes, no mesh, no adornments are permitted. No costumes.

Headpieces - A single matching colour ribbon only can be worn. No sparkles, no flowers, no adornments are to be worn in hair.

Ballet Shoes – either ballet flats, demi pointes or pointe shoes, as per their chosen dance or variation.

Note - Advanced 1 and 2 students also have the option of wearing black bike shorts or black ¾ tights with Leotard for the Contemporary Solo.

Male identifying - classical examination attire at all levels.

### Which Level Should I Enter?

Students must have passed the

✓ relevant RAD exam level in 2022
to be eligible to enter the Jacqueline
Morland Awards

Students must enter the same level of the exam that they completed in ✓ 2022. If they completed more than one exam, they must enter the level of the most recent exam completed in 2022.

### Terms and Conditions of Entry

- Entries are via Trybooking only and close on Monday 27 Feb 2023 at 8.00AM. Entry fee is non-refundable and late entries cannot be accepted.
- Participants must be studying the Royal Academy of Dance (RAD) Syllabus, be residing in the Queensland and Northern New South Wales areas north of and including Coffs Harbour, and be enrolled with RAD Registered teachers in these areas at time of entry and at time of event.
- Students must have sat and passed a relevant Royal Academy of Dance examination level in 2022 to be eligible to enter the awards.
- It is the responsibility of the teacher/parent and student to enter the correct level. A breach in this regulation could result in disqualification.

- All students are required to wear classical examination attire and hair accessories only as per dress code.
- Advanced 1 and Advanced 2 entrants must attend the Contemporary Solo session at Adrenaline Performing Arts: 27/1472 Boundary Road, Wacol, Qld 4076 from 10:30am to 2.15pm before attending the open class at St John's.
- RAD reserves the right to make alterations where necessary.
- The judge's decision is final.
- Past Winners of either Advanced 1 or Advanced 2 cannot compete again in the Jacqueline Morland Awards.
- Entrants agree that photographic images taken during the event may be used for promotional and/or reporting purposes, unless they inform RAD otherwise.
- RAD should be notified in writing of any medical conditions when enrolling for the Awards. Candidates participate at their own risk.
- The Code of Conduct for teachers and parents on the RAD website must be adhered to or a competitor will be disqualified from the Awards.
- RAD Australia follows all current government and public health COVID-19 requirements - please refer to QLD Government website for current requirements prior to registering or attending any part of this event.
