- Entries are via Trybooking only and close on Monday 30 January at 8:00AM. The entry fee is non-refundable and late entries cannot be accepted.
- Entry fee includes a costume as selected by the choreographer (not including shoes), as well as a Jacqueline Morland Awards t shirt.
- Students must enter the same level that they will be training as of Term 1, 2023.
- Students must be studying the Royal Academy of Dance (RAD) Syllabus at time of entry and at time of event/performance at the Jacqueline Morland Awards.
- Students must attend all rehearsals for their Dance Performance Group as outlined on the flyer and website. Students who miss a rehearsal will not be able to perform at the Jacqueline Morland Awards. Rehearsals take place on Sunday 19 and 26 February, and Sunday 5 and 12 March at SJ Block, Kelvin Grove State College.
- Students must also attend the final stage rehearsal and performance for their Dance Performance Group on Sunday 19 March at St John's College Auditorium at the allocated time and wear the chosen costume.
- Entry fees are non-refundable, and if a student is no longer able to participate or perform the entry fee will be forfeited.
- The information is correct at time of publication and RAD reserves the right to make changes where necessary.
- Entrants agree that photographic images taken during the event may be used for promotional and/or reporting purposes unless they inform RAD otherwise.
